Running Record Reading Goals for Fifth Grade



1st Trimester: Independent T

2nd Trimester: Independent U

3rd Trimester: Independent U/V

Running records are administered to students throughout the year to determine the appropriate independent and instructional reading levels. During a running record, a child reads a leveled passage, then retells the story and answers a set of questions to determine understanding of events and characters.

The <u>INDEPENDENT</u> level is the level at which a student can read and understand without support. This requires a high level of comprehension, the ability to retell and converse about the story, strong decoding capabilities for that level, and the ability to monitor his/her reading and reading behaviors. The books your child brings home in his or her reading bag, are the books at their independent reading level.

The <u>INSTRUCTIONAL</u> level is the level at which learning takes place. The teacher provides the needed support for challenging vocabulary, concepts, structures, and phonetic work - prompting and teaching the child to employ new strategies when reading new text. Your child reads books at both their independent and instructional level during our reading workshop.

The <u>FRUSTRATION/HARD</u> level is when a student cannot successfully navigate the text either in accuracy or comprehension, even when support is available.
