




The courses (1), Total Credits (2), and Alternate Credits (3) will appear




To change a course you have selected, click *Edit* and unselect the courses you no longer want



Total Credits

- Students in grades 9, 10 and 11 should select at least 7 credits. 8 is the maximum credit hours that can be completed in a school year. 7 credits would mean 1 block study hall. 7.5 credits would mean 1 quarter study hall
- Grade 12 students should request at least enough credits to meet graduation requirements (28 standard diploma, 29 pathway or scholars diploma)
- Total credits should not include alternate course credits



Graduation Requirements

Because fulfillment of requirements cannot be determined until all final grades are complete, the designation of the diploma will be determined after graduation. Souderton Area High School believes that the transcript that students build in attempt to earn a Pathway or Scholars Diploma will make them the most competitive graduates.

 once received if they did not receive a course requested to meet graduation
 requirements, did not meet a prerequisite or would like to increase rigor.
- Changing teachers, no longer interested in the course or adding senior privilege will not be considered for course change requests.
