# Daily Routine

The high school runs on a block schedule. This is different than the middle school as our students attend fewer blocks per day for a longer period of time. Students attend four blocks/day with the exception of Mondays where we hold a short 5th block **advisory** period. Students are assigned to a 5th block and 5th block teacher for all four years. Fifth block is designed to create peer connections, and learn key skills in the areas of organization, time management, goal setting, study skills, and communication. Freshmen benefit from this time by allowing them to receive guidance from upperclassmen and support from their 5th block teacher as they adjust to the increased academic rigor of high school and getting involved in extracurricular activities at SAHS. The high school also holds **RED ZONE** everyday in the morning. **RED ZONE** is an opportunity for students to meet with teachers to ask questions, seek extra help, and to complete assignments. It's also a time clubs can meet. The cafeteria is open during **RED ZONE** for students to purchase and eat breakfast before classes.

## What about . . .

### Gym

Many freshmen express concern over gym, gym lockers, and swimming. The wellness teacher will explain class expectations on the first day of class. After the first day, students are required to change for gym, but there **is not** a required uniform. School appropriate shorts, t-shirt, and athletic shoes are all that's needed. For swimming, males are expected to wear swim trunks and females are expected to wear a one piece bathing suit. Any questions can be answered by your physical education teacher on the first day of class. Gym lockers at SAHS do not have locks. Please bring in a combination lock to secure your belongings during gym. We ask that you remove the lock after each class and bring it back in for the next class.



### Lockers

Not all students use lockers at the high school but if a student would like to have a locker assigned to them, they simply need to stop by Guidance (once school starts) and request one! We will work with students to come up with the best location according to their class schedule and/or bus. See Mrs. Kester in Guidance.

## School Supply Suggestions

By the time most students come to the high school, they have a good idea of how they like to organize their school work. Some students keep everything in one binder while others prefer multiple small binders. Although students should figure out what works best for them, below is a list of *suggestions* meant to guide students in purchasing school supplies. Teachers will discuss the particular needs for their class the first few days of school but the list below will get you started. ***Some type of agenda is strongly recommended for ALL students.***

English 9	3 ring binder, writing utensils, lined paper
US History	3 ring binder, pencils, highlighter
Science 9	3 ring binder with dividers that can be labeled, pens, pencils, erasers
Algebra I	TI-84 plus graphing calculator (can be used all four years at the high school and into college), 3 ring binder, paper, folder, pencils, erasers, single spiral notebook
Spanish I/II French I/II	Spiral notebook (70 page) or a 3 ring binder with dividers, pencils, colored pen, dry erase markers, headphones/earbuds that connect to computer

## Technology

Students will receive their laptops during the first few days of school in 5th block. For computer support, our Tech HUB is available to assist students during school hours and is located in the Student Center on the right hand side. Students can also fill out a [Help Desk Ticket Form](#) and a technician will get in touch with the student to resolve the issue.

## Attendance

Attendance is located next to the Main Office across from the Nurse's Office. The attendance procedures at SAHS are very similar to those at the middle schools. Notes are required for late arrivals, early dismissals, and absences. If a student does not turn in a parental excuse note by the third day following an absence, the absence will be coded unexcused/unlawful. For high school early dismissals, if an attendance note was provided in advance, parents/guardians do not have to enter the high school to sign their student out. Students will simply sign themselves out at the security desk and meet the parent/guardian outside, in the front of the building. 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## Transportation - Drop-off...Pick-up...Late Bus

Most freshman take the bus. As in middle school, buses drop students off in the bus loop and are lined up in the bus loop at the end of the day. To assist in finding your bus at the end of the day, maps are posted at every bus loop exit showing where buses will be parked. Students will practice bus procedures at Freshmen Orientation.

As you can imagine, there is a lot of traffic at the high school. For this reason, we ask parents to adhere to the following guidelines.

### **Student DROP-OFF takes place in the REAR of the building.**

Parents are asked to enter through the Halteman entrance and follow the drop off line, having your student exit the vehicle at the curb.

### **Student PICK-UP takes place in the FRONT of the building.**

We kindly ask parents **NOT** to pick up in the rear of our school as this is where our students with special needs get their buses.

Beginning September 5th, late buses run Tuesday and Thursday afternoons, leaving the high school at 4:10PM. This allows many students to stay after school for clubs or to meet with teachers. Students should approach one of the late bus drivers and ask which bus will be going to their address. The driver will advise the student as to which bus they should take.



## Summer Reading Assignments - Honors English 9

Be sure to have your summer reading completed prior to the start of school. If your English class is second semester, it's still a good idea to do the reading over the summer and take notes you can review when it comes time for the assessment. Students can expect an assessment on their summer reading early in the semester. The assessment will count as no more than 15% of the first marking period. More information available [HERE](#).

## Evacuation Drills

During the first week of school, 5th Block teachers will review the evacuation procedures with students. Students will be advised where to meet their 5th Block on both the bus loop and the football field and be brought outside to find both locations. Students are encouraged to make a note of their 5th block teacher's name as well as their bus loop and field meeting spots on their phone. It is **IMPERITIVE** students take all drills/incidents seriously and immediately report to their assigned 5th block locations for attendance.

## Cell Phone Policy 2023-2024

Electronic devices, including phones and headphones, are not permitted during class, including 5th block, unless otherwise stated by the teacher.

Headphones must not be visible during instructional time.

Some teachers will require students to put their phone in a caddy as they enter the classroom.

Phones may be used in the hallways between blocks, in the cafeteria, and during study hall.

***Recording or picture taking is prohibited unless permission has been granted.***

## What is...

**Home Access Center** - HAC is a portal that students and parents/guardians can log onto and view their student's grades, schedule, attendance, etc. Students should be checking HAC on a weekly basis to monitor their grades and assignments. HAC is how students and parents/guardians will view report cards. Student or parent questions about login/password can be answer in Student Services or Guidance.

**Link Crew** - Link Crew is a student leadership/mentor program focused on welcoming freshmen to high school, making them feel comfortable throughout their first year and helping them discover academic success through the support of their peers. Link Crew runs programs throughout the year in 5th block and **RED ZONE**.

**Naviance** - Naviance is a program that assists students in their career exploration, college search, and the college application process. Students will be introduced to Naviance in Career Exploration class and will continue to use Naviance through high school.

**Pathway 360°** - The Pathways program helps students discover their strengths, set goals and explore career options while still in high school. Every student will be given a pathwayMANAGER account which will allow them to keep track of classes, credits, job shadows and mentorships and written reflections. **Red Alert** - Red Alert is a LIVE student run broadcast from our very own TV studio. It is broadcast every Friday and is the best show in the 10:49 timeslot! Red Alert is taken as a class offered to upperclassmen students. Interested? Talk to your guidance counselor!

**RED ZONE - RED ZONE** is a 30 minute period at the start of every school day that provides students the opportunity to meet with teachers to ask questions, seek extra help, and to complete assignments. It's also a time for clubs to meet. Attendance is taken after **RED ZONE** at the start of first block. The cafeteria is open during **RED ZONE** for students to purchase and eat breakfast before classes.

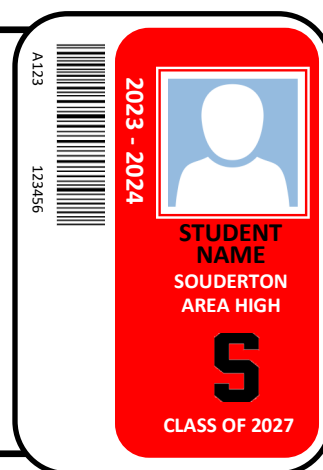
**Schoology** - Schoology is a learning management system which allows students to access course content, use class resources, participate in discussions, and submit assignments. Students will use Schoology on a daily basis.

School IDs are needed at the high school! Students use them to sign in when they arrive late, attend dances/events, and make purchases from the cafeteria. They are generated from pictures taken on picture day in the fall. Even if you do not want to purchase pictures, we ask **ALL** students to have their picture taken so they will get an ID.
